

Lee Public Library Wireless Access Policy

Introduction

The Lee Public Library offers free access to the Internet. The Internet is to be used primarily for research and informational purposes. The Lee Public Library draws from the N.H. State Library Association policies regarding use of the Internet.

The information available on the Internet includes much that is personal, professionally and culturally enriching. On the other hand, it also provides access to information that may be offensive or disturbing to some individuals as well as to information that may be factually incorrect or illegal. The library staff offers assistance, guidance and instruction on using the Internet as a research and information tool as we do with all reference sources.

The Lee Public Library provides free wireless public Internet access. Users may connect to the Internet from their laptop computers when sitting within range of the wireless network.

User Responsibilities

Users are responsible for configuring their own equipment. The library does not provide technical support for establishing or maintaining a connection nor equipment configurations. The library is not responsible for any changes made to a computer's settings and does not guarantee that a user's hardware will work with the library's wireless connection.

The Lee Public Library has no control over the information accessed and cannot be held responsible for the content, accuracy or quality of the information retrieved on the Internet. Unlike other library resources, the Internet is not organized, catalogued or indexed.

The library's wireless network is not secure. Information sent to and from your laptop or wireless device may be viewed by anyone else with a wireless device and the appropriate software.

The Lee Public Library is not responsible for any personal information (e.g., credit card) that is stolen, or for any damage caused to hardware or software due to power surges, security issues or problems caused by viruses or hacking. All wireless access users are individually responsible for maintaining up-to-date virus and spyware protection on personal laptop computers or wireless devices.

Printing service via the wireless network is not possible at this time. To print at the library, you must save your work to a disk or email it to your email account and then access the document through the library's public access computer and send it to the public printer.
