

## Woman seriously injured in Lee crash

LEE — A 77-year-old woman was seriously injured after her PT Cruiser collided with an armored truck on Route 155 shortly before 1 p.m. today.

The woman was turning onto Route 155 from Snell Road.

Investigators remain on scene.

## Exeter woman dies in armored truck, car collision in Lee

LEE — An 84-year-old woman was killed Monday afternoon when her vehicle collided with an armored truck traveling on Route 155.

Police say Sheila Hull of 7 Riverwood Drive in Exeter died shortly after the accident at Wentworth-Douglass Hospital in Dover. The accident was reported at 12:54 p.m.

Hull was driving a gold 2005 Chrysler PT



Cruiser and was traveling on Snell Road when she crossed Route 155 to get to Route 155A and pulled out in front of a southbound Loomis armored truck driven by Edward Roehl Jr., 23, of Manchester, according to Lee Police Sgt. Thomas Dronsfield.

The armored truck then T-boned Hull's vehicle in the driver's side door.

"For whatever reason she pulled into the southbound lane of the armored truck," Dronsfield said. "We'll probably never know why."

Dronsfield said three witnesses were interviewed at the accident scene and all indicated it appeared Hull pulled out in front of the truck and it didn't have a chance to stop. The witnesses were Roehl, his passenger and a vehicle traveling behind the truck, Dronsfield said.

There were no skid marks at the accident scene indicating the truck had time to react, Dronsfield added. Dronsfield said there will be no charges or citations issued against Roehl.

Durham Deputy Police Chief Rene Kelley was one of the first people on the scene of the accident as he was driving in the area and came across it. He said Hull was unconscious when he got to her but still had a pulse.

Kelley said he lost her pulse just a few minutes before fire and rescue crews arrived.

Hull was alone in her vehicle, with the exception of her small dog. The dog was uninjured and placed in a police cruiser.

Snell Road is located near the Route 4 on ramp and traffic in that area was restricted for more than four hours as members of the Strafford County Technical Accident Reconstruction Team investigated the accident.

Durham police and fire and Barrington police assisted local police and fire at the accident scene.
