The Lee Conservation Commission is once again sponsoring a campership for a Lee youngster, who must be at least 10 years old. The camper will go to Barry Conservation Camp, which is located in Berlin, NH in the White Mountain National Forest. The camp is operated by UNH Cooperative Extension 4-H in conjunction with the N.H. Fish and Game Department. SNOW CASTING NOTICE

The Town has been experiencing more and more issues with snow casting. The road crews have been working very hard to keep our roads clear only to have some residents plow, snow blow or shovel snow back onto the roads. The Town has posted this numerous times on Facebook and in the E-Crier along with issuing warnings but to no avail! The Police Department will be issuing fines from this point forward. The Town of Lee Snow Casting Ordinance was adopted by the Lee Select Board on 1/7/2008 which states that no person shall throw or allow to be thrown, cast, placed or deposited any snow or ice into or upon the plowed portion of any street, sidewalk or public way in the Town of Lee, it being the intent and purpose of this ordinance to prohibit all persons from throwing, casting, placing or depositing snow and ice in such manner as to become a hazard to vehicular or pedestrian traffic. In the event that a contractor is hired for snow removal and is not present at the time of the violation, the home owner, landlord or lessee shall be held responsible. Any violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of up to (\$100.00) one hundred dollars.

YES, please!


On the left:

- Antifreeze




On the right behind the building:

- Wood pallets on the left (drop or take)
- Scrap metal (no fee)
- Construction debris, appliances and other bulky items (ask an attendant about fees or see https://www.leenh.org/transfer-station/pages/bulky-waste-fees)

Having your name and number on a mailbox is just not enough. Some mailboxes are clustered together. The numbers are small and the location may not mark the entrance to your driveway.

The Lee Firemen's Association, in a joint effort with the Lee Fire Department, has a program to install reflective house number signs at driveway entrances to assist all emergency responders in locating your home in a time of need. The cost for each sign with a post is \$30.00 and it will be installed by the Lee Firemen's Association.





SCHOOL BOARD NEWS - December 18, 2019

School Calendar News: February 11, 2020 will be a Staff Workshop Day with no school for students. Presidential Primary Voting will take place at the High School and Mast Way School that day. To make up for this, May 22, 2020 (formerly a teacher workday) will be a normal school day.

The School Board also adopted the 2020-2021 school year calendar. School will start August 27, 2020. There will be no school on September 4th or September 7th (Labor Day).

The proposed 2020-2021 school district budget will be set by the school board at the January 8, 2020 meeting. On January 15, 2020, in the High School auditorium, the community is asked to provide input on the budget and proposed middle school bond at the annual Budget and Bond Hearing.

The School District Deliberative Session, where any school district voter can again participate in discussing (and changing) the proposed budget or other items, will be February 4, 2020 in the High School auditorium (weather-permitting). Voting for 2 school board seats, the budget, teacher contract, and proposed middle school will take place on March 10, 2020.

The District is working with the UNH Survey Center to construct a survey about the middle school progress report. Input from parents, staff, and school board has contributed. The survey is expected to be conducted in February.

Schools are closed for vacation from December 23rd - January 1st. Happy New Year!

NHES Operation VET Connect

Operation VETS Connect is a challenge to connect those who served and those who are serving and their spouses to employment, training and services they need to return to employment or into training to assist them with obtaining employment. Additional goals are to build an employer's awareness of the benefits to hiring those who served along with the awareness for those who served of the skills they have or need to build on to return to employment.

Employers are asked to register for the challenge by completing the registration form on the website under Job Fairs. (http://www.nhes.nh.gov/media/job-fairs/index.htm) The information from their registration form will be entered into a spreadsheet by Operations staff and made available to the offices. The employer name, industry, and town/city will also be listed on the website weekly. ESRs and LVERs should verify that the employer is registered in JMS and if appropriate, contact the employer to advise of the services available to them, including RTW and OJT.

Veterans, those currently serving and their spouses are also asked to complete a registration form on the website under Job Fairs. (http://www.nhes.nh.gov/media/job-fairs/index.htm) Their information will be entered into a separate spreadsheet and distributed to the office nearest their homes.
