## HELPFUL HINTS

## Signs and Symptoms of a Heart Attack

- Uncomfortable pressure
- Squeezing
- Fullness or pain in center of chest that lasts more than a few minutes
- Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- Shortness of breath
- Nausea
- Lightheadedness

## Signs and Symptoms of a Stroke

- Sudden numbness or weakness
   of the face, arm or leg
   (especially on one side of the body)
- Trouble seeing in one or both eyes
  - Trouble walking
  - Loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden confusion
- Trouble speaking or understanding

### Preventing Falls—Making Your Home Safe

- Remove things you can trip over such as papers, books, clothes and shoes.
- Remove small throw rugs.
- Keep items used often in cabinets you can reach easily without a step stool.
- Have grab bars put in next to your toilet and in the tub or shower.
- Use non-slip mats in the bathroom.
- Improve lighting in your home.
- Have handrails put in on staircases.
- Wear shoes that give good support and have non-slip soles.
- Avoid slippers.
