# MINUTES OF THE LEE FAIR COMMITTEE MEETING <br> Wednesday, September 28, 2022 <br> 3:00PM

Caren Rossi explained that she and Tom have collected to date $\$ 7,800$ for this years event and after the June event money etc. it will leave a balance of about $\$ 16,178$. Caren received a $\$ 100$ donation just yesterday that has not yet been deposited. The recreation commission encumbered $\$ 3,500$ dollars towards the fire works as well as the Agricultural Commission contributed $\$ 1,000$. Leaving the fireworks to only cost the fair committee $\$ 4,500$. The group discussed the fireworks. Caren Rossi read the letter from the fireworks company about the class c (in file) the committee determined that next year they will request the Select Board to contribute half but anticipate having to pay for them all. They didn't feel it was good to go from this years 30 min show to a 12 minutes show for only a savings of $\$ 3,000$.

Caren Rossi explained that ORYA is exploring getting a concession trailer to be able to sell concessions as a fund raiser. She thought next year they should sell hamburgers, hot dogs and drinks at the fair. This was a complaint she got from several people. Needed more food and drinks.

Others agreed. Then also discussed starting at noon to give more time for food sales and events. The events seemed cramped.

## Bingo

Caren Rossi explained that Scott Bugbee expressed that it was a lot of work for a little bit of money. Not sure if they would do it next year.

The committee asked Caren Rossi to reach out to Mary's Dogs to see if they would be interested in doing it again.

## Car Show

Erick Sawtelle asked if parking the cars out-front by the sign was an option for next year.
Tom Dronsfield said that there is not enough room and having them out front would cause a traffic problem with people driving by and stopping along the road to see them. Perhaps it should be a separate event.

Others agreed. No decision made.
Caren Rossi commented that in years past the fire department puts there trucks out there.

## Farm Games

Chuck Cox said that farm games were very successful. About 30 people participated. It would be nice to have a board to put the results so people can see how they compare to others. Need more people to help run the event.

Tom Dronsfield said it would be nice to be able to do some type of awards ceremony at the end of the day.

Others agreed.

## Dinner

Erick Sawtelle said it went well, over 400 people served. Hard to say exact as a mix up with the tickets. Ran out of food. Next year need more chicken and mac and cheese, which was a big hit. Need more people to help serve and prepare etc.

## Games

Sherry Griffith said her games were a huge hit. Frying pan toss had about 16 people. She too needs more people to help. She is in support of stating earlier too.

## Children's Parade

Sherry Griffith said next year Nellie Telling and her friend are taking it over.

## Tractor Parade

Laura Gund said it was great. Others agreed. She said that she had heard complaints from committees members for having to lug stuff and not be able to drive their cars in.

The committee agreed but said that they were all told ahead of time. This is for safety.

## Ice Cream

Gloria Quigley stated that it went well and they netted $\$ 917$ they had a container and a half of ice cream left.

## Pie Eating Contest

Caren Rossi explained that Chris Moreau would like to run the pie eating contest next year.

## Layout

Erick Sawtelle stated we should move the committees and commission on the other side of the courts. And move the serving tent across to the other side of the driveway.
Others agreed.
Next year it was determined that we would start at 12:00pm and sell more food and drinks.

## Minutes
