Minutes: Scott made a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting, as read by Laura. Donna seconded the motion and it passed.

Financial: There have been no changes in the finances at this time. We discussed the possibility of sponsoring the second printing of the Bicentennial Cookbook.

Membership: Anne Jennison has, unfortunately, resigned from the Commission, due to health reasons. Scott made a motion that Anne become an alternate member until such time as she is able to attend meetings. Donna seconded the motion and it passed. Pat spoke to Meredith Brown about becoming a member of this Commission, but apparently she has no time presently to become a member.
