Dean will supply: Gazebo, chairs, 3 tables for booth.

Paul: Composting at the fair. Concentrate only on food waste, not plates, etc. 300 heads of corn. Get Steve to bring 3 bins / as many bins as possible. Get volunteers to aid diners in discarding their food waste. Ask SWC for more volunteers, up to six half hour shifts. Fireworks at 8.

Ask energy committee about electric car display. (Paul?)

Jen: Abut booths for energy committee, conservation committee, sustainability and solid waste

### E. (Paul) Useless/Use Less Campaign Work Session/Revisions
